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
Paula,

what's your story?

I wanted to write to you on behalf of my son Jonah Judge. Jonah entered the Florida Elks therapy program and started working with Nikki Guarino, the BEST therapist of any kind Jonah has ever worked with and unfortunately, he has worked with a ton. A little background on Jonah- he was born at 41 weeks 1 day and suffered from the HIE diagnosis (lack of oxygen at birth). The future of Jonah's life was uncertain in the beginning. There were days we weren't sure if Jonah would ever crawl, walk or even know what love is. Jonah has defied all the odds, and I pray he continues to do so. As soon as Nikki started working with Jonah you could see the bond they shared. Some therapists Jonah had worked with in the past would forcefully make Jonah participate in an activity even if Jonah showed zero interest in it. I don't think Jonah was retaining anything out of mere frustration, he wasn't into the task. Nikki did not do this, she mirrored Jonah and was "usually" able to catch his interest, and if not made alternate plans for the session. Since working with Nikki, Jonah has made tremendous progress. He has crawled, walked, learned to play with different toys, is now learning to feed himself, and most importantly knows he's loved and reciprocates love! She saw how smart Jonah is and knew he could do almost anything a "normal" two-year-old could do, with a little extra training and love. Not only does she care for the kids, but the parents too. One time I had a scheduled conference call with a professional who I had previous interactions with and was very intimidated and nervous for the planned call. This professional always used big medical terms and didn't explain Jonah's status in terms I could understand. I was sharing this with Nikki. Nikki kindly offered that on her own time she would be there for this planned conference call and helped facilitate what I wanted to express and interpreted what professional was explaining. What kind of person shares their own time with the parent of a child who needs help?, an AWESOME PERSON, a CARING PERSON, a COMPASSIONATE PERSON, an EMPATHETIC PERSON, someone who cares about others. This is what Nikki is. Thank you Elks for having people like Nikki available to help others! She deserves a KUDOS in the most extreme way!






















THERAPY SPOTLIGHTS VOLUME 1 - JAN 2022

These are twins Alex and Becca. They were born prematurely. From day 1, they have struggled meeting developmental milestones. When the twins began physical therapy treatments, they were not even walking on their own. They have since thrived, and are making great strides! Becca is a "little mommy" and loves playing with her baby dolls and play kitchen. She battles with hypotonia, which is low muscle tone. She is improving her strength and is now able to climb up and down stairs independently while holding the wall or rail. She still struggles with jumping and running, but is so close to meeting those milestones! Alex is a lover of all sports, but basketball is his favorite! Alex has great coordination and can dribble a basketball all around the house. He is all boy and loves to be active, running around, jumping, and playing with his older siblings. He struggles with sensory processing skills and core strength, which makes him walk on his tippy toes. We are working on a daily stretching routine to make sure his calves and muscle tendons do not get too tight. He was recently fitted for orthotics to wear on his feet while wearing shoes, which makes him walk better posture. These babies are such a joy to work with, and their family is so grateful for the services provided by FECTS.
